

Code of Conduct - concise

GENERAL CONDUCT

WYMUN delegates are expected to act as diplomats, representing their countries and schools with high standards of personal behaviour. Schools are encouraged to select students carefully to avoid disciplinary issues, ensuring that delegates maintain the reputation of both WYMUN and their institutions.

As the conference takes place in the People's Republic of China, delegates must respect local laws and customs. Politically sensitive remarks or behaviour will not be tolerated. BWYA's MUN Directors and Secretariats reserve the right to make the final decision regarding any and all violations, as deemed appropriate.

MUN DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES

Students must be accompanied by at least one MUN-Director from their school, who will be responsible for their conduct. Directors are required to stay in the same hotel as their students and ensure students attend all sessions.

BEHAVIOUR AT BWYA

Delegates and teachers must show courtesy to all BWYA staff and WYMUN volunteers. Smoking and alcohol consumption are prohibited on campus during the conference.

DRESS CODE

Delegates must wear formal attire, similar to that of real UN diplomats. National dress, military uniforms, and armbands are not permitted. As a general guideline, knees, midriffs and shoulders should be covered, shirts tucked in, ties properly tied, and shoes should be formal.

USE OF TECHNOLOGY

Resolutions and materials will be distributed digitally. Internet and social media use during sessions is prohibited, and devices should be used solely for conference purposes. Phones must be in silent mode. Misuse of technology may result in confiscation of devices.

TOBACCO, ALCOHOL AND DRUGS

The use of tobacco, alcohol, or illicit drugs is strictly forbidden at BWYA. MUN-Directors are responsible for enforcing these rules for their students.

UNDIPLOMATIC BEHAVIOUR, HARASSMENT, AND DISCRIMINATION

WYMUN will not tolerate undiplomatic conduct, harassment, or discrimination. Any concerns should be reported to WYMUN staff, and serious infractions may result in expulsion from the conference or barring from future events.
